



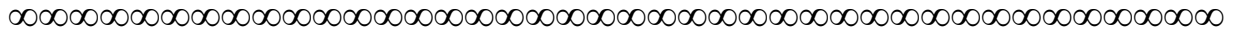

Tavares, Florida – It was as if a week of meetings had build up a reserve of energy. Some of the members from around the county had a chance to use some of that energy with us. The Harris Chain Sail & Power Squadron hosted a first ever, National level, Boater Operation Certification (BOC) on February 7th 2010. Through the efforts of many of the National, District and Harris Chain members, 26 students descended on our chain of lakes, for 2 segments of the certification process.

Members of the National organization from California, Iowa, New York and even Connecticut enjoyed a wee bit of Lake County hospitality. A couple of guys from Banana River even made the trek! We were fortunate enough to obtain spots for P/Lt/C Ralph Shrivalle, AP, Al Gansz, AP, P/C Joe Rzewuski, AP, P/Lt/C Cathy Henke, P & Cdr Tim Henke, AP. New affiliate member P/C Robert McDonnell, AP, also attended the training.

The first, and primary segment was the on the water training testing of proficiency. All students took the helm of various member's boats, including the Harris Chain Boat. Students were required to perform numerous maneuvers while captaining the vessels. A show of seamanship skills were evaluated during each of the drills. A few folks needed a couple of tries but everyone was successful in the end.

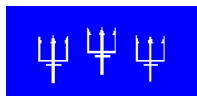
The BOC is a certification that parallels United Nations Resolution 40. This is the only recreational boating certification that actually tests on the water proficiency. To achieve this rating there are numerous courses required. Instead of chasing all of these, members that have Advanced Piloting, VHF radio And Weather seminars, with elective classes of Marine Electronics and Engine Maintenance qualify for the educational aspect. One other module that is needed is on Fire Extinguishers. Seeing that many of the students needed this module Tim provided a didactic and hands on, live fire, practical session. It was surprising how many people have never operated a fire extinguisher until that day!

A special thanks to P/Lt/C Ralph Shrivalle, AP & Cdr Tim Henke, AP for making their boats available, to everyone, for this training session.

P/C Betty Binder's, P wish to have the donated boat came true as the new squadron boat preformed flawlessly. Several other squadrons were more than a bit jealous that we had a fully functional, Vessel Safety Check boat in our Squadron.

Commander's Message

The Month of February was one to remember. Being a voting member of the National meeting was a great experience. All the Commanders of District 23 lined up with District Commander Bob Becker, SN in our assigned area. Seeing the balance of the districts, in their assigned area was great. Behind the District sections with their Commanders was an area, for other voting members and general audience. Adorning the front of the room was the biggest Ensign that I could ever conceive. What a feeling of “oneness”.

A generous amount of procedural pomp was employed, following power squadron traditions. This brought me back to a more formal aspect of previous years in the squadron.

The biggest event of the meetings, for our daily operations, was that we now may offer all classes to non-members. The hook was that we sell our classes to the general public at a premium. This premium is the cost of at least a 1 year membership. Changes to the Education Department were made. The BOC has been recognized and assigned national officers. There were some subtle changes and modifications to the operations manual will result from these changes.

A new level of membership is available. It is called a cyber member. A cyber member is a person that signs up, with national, online. They then take classes online. Then the cyber member needs to come to us for grade or elective testing. This is where we need to convert them to be a “regular” member. So, be aware of our newest class of membership and if you run across one, invite them to join the Harris Chain.

The long of the short of the meetings is that are membership is falling. There is an assigned critical mass of 30,000 members. This minimum will be needed to maintain operations at national, in its current capacity. You may remember that, I was a factor in passing a resolution, (at a District level, taken to national) to have the national meetings reduced to a single meeting per year. Like everyone else District 23 told national to reduce its expenses. Perhaps the resolution will fall on someone that listens.

At our last bridge Meeting I assigned Lt/C Arthur Grae, S to head a new adhoc committee. This committee will be known as the Ways and Means committee. Seeing a potential shortfall in our funding, I did not want to raise dues. Therefore, Arthur will be presenting ideas on generating cash. The first idea was to sell advertising in our newsletter. More information, to follow, as available.

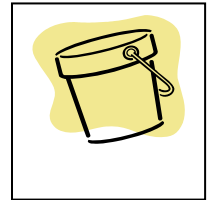

Monthly Trivia:



When considering wiring a bilge pump, which two factors should be considered to activate the pump.

When sizing a pump, what size is the best?



When wiring in a bilge pump it should be able to be activated in 2 ways. Manually with a switch and also to be able to be activated using a “float switch” located in a low spot of the bilge. This switch needs to be in place to cause the pump to come on if there is an accumulation of water. It is also a great idea to have a 2nd pump that functions independently of the first. The second float switch would be a bit higher than the first and possibly having an audible alarm wired into the circuit. Use the old adage of 1 is good, 2 is better !

Education Notes:

For those folks without a “letter” behind you name, a Seamanship class will be held at the conclusion of the Engine Maintenance class. This is the first in a series of classes that will allow the member to “climb the Power Squadron Educational ladder”.

The Engine Maintenance class is well into the series of classes. It is interesting to find out what you knew or did not know!

The Newest rewrite of the marine electronics course is out. It includes numerous updates on DSC, AIS, MMSI, FCC and SAT phones. Sound like alphabet soup? Take the class and make sense of it all !

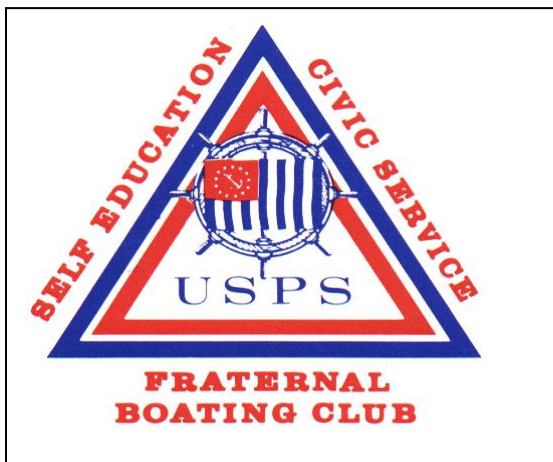
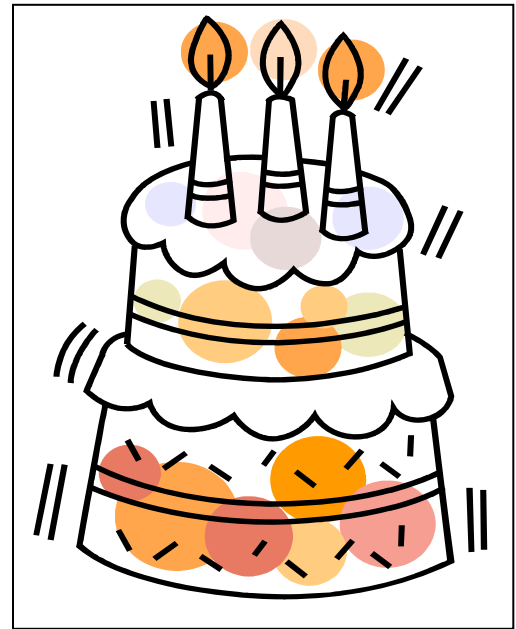

As you know we had \$1500 invested in this program for the last two years and the money was returned to us, with interest, in January. We will be making a decision to invest approximately \$2000.00 in a Certificate of Deposit at a local financial institution within the next couple of weeks. Interest rates are not the greatest right now but our investment will be insured by the FDIC and some interest is better than no interest.

I have also contacted the Audit Committee and we will be meeting in the near future to certify the books for 2009.

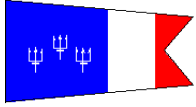

A busy March is planned, and it should place us well along on the way to a record year for VSC's. On Sunday, March 14, inspectors not at the Villages Exposition will be at two Lake County boat launch sites. We expect the Coast Guard Auxiliary to be at one of three Leesburg launch sites on each of the Sundays in March, so we'll remain flexible for location. That's the second Sunday in March, and we'll return to the third Sunday beginning in April to get back to our long time monthly schedule.

On Saturday, March 20 inspections are scheduled for The Lake Harris Wharf (on Rt 19, Tavares), and at The Hawthorne Community Boat Club on Rt 27 south of Leesburg. Two to four inspectors at each site should be enough, and we'll begin at 9:30. More later on specifics as to entry, etc.

On Sunday, March 21, we'll be inspecting our squadron boats at the Blessing of the Fleet, Arrive prior to noon and inspections will take place until 1:30 (see the flyer in this Anchor Chain issue). Bring your pfd as these inspections will all be on the water, your own boat if desired, stay for the blessing, and go on the cruise!

Another great opportunity to invite the members to join with us. Remember, each one of us is a salesperson for USPS. Let's show headquarters that we in D 23 not only are up to the challenge, let's prove we can do it!

In talking with members of our Jacksonville Squadron, they assure me the spring D 23 conference will be one of the best yet. Special rates at the Hyatt right on the St. Johns River waterfront, a Friday night patriotic theme, great food, good guest speakers on Saturday and a chance to meet many of our USPS friends. I would like to see many of our newer members attend and let them see what the district does. Promote the conference to each and all within your squadron.
